
## Using the Google Document Research Tool


Students who use Google Docs to create work, can access the Drive App Research Tool. This allows students to search the Internet inside their Doc. The search includes Google, Google Images, Google Quotes, Google Scholar, and Google Dictionary.

## Create the Google Document and Locate the Research Toolbar

- Login to your DoDEA Google account and access your Drive.
- 2. Create a new Document




- 3. On the right-side of the screen you will see the Research Toolbar. Using the dropdown menu, you can select which research search tool to use.
  - a. **Everything** Search the Internet via the Google search engine
  - b. **Scholar Article Search** Explore academic articles and add citations and references to your work using Scholar search
  - c. *Image Search* Find images from around the web using image search. You can even filter images by usage rights.
  - d. **Quote Search** Add inspirational, funny, or thought provoking quotes to your projects by using quotation search
  - e. **Dictionary Search** Use dictionary search to find definitions or synonyms for a word. You can also find definitions from around the web


